

#### Letter from Laurene

Not exactly inspiring thoughts as it is quite easy to go down the proverbial rabbit hole of angst when focusing on hard news of the day.

What is your joy? This jolting question was and is an invitation to a more balanced and intentional perspective. As people of faith, we are invited to be mindful of the challenges and difficulties in our lives and world from the larger faith perspective. Pondering my response reminded me that there is a vital need for the cultivation of joy in my life and our lives, particularly during these challenging times. The presence of joy and delight serves to fuel our souls. The wisdom of Brother David Steindl-Rast is helpful in this regard,

"We hold the key to lasting happiness in our own hands. For it is not joy that makes us grateful; it is gratitude that makes us joyful."

Over the years, I have found that the intentional practice of being grateful each day has been an inspiring transformational balm for healing and living a more faithful life. ## From the General Assembly 2022

- The General Assembly gave final approval to the legislation that will allow Kirk ministers and deacons to register to become celebrants of same sex marriages if they wish.
- The General Assembly overwhelmingly approved a Declaration of Friendship with the Catholic Church in Scotland. The Declaration is to be named the Saint Margaret Declaration.
- The General Assembly condemned the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and called for an immediate ceasefire and a 'just and peaceful solution which respects human rights, democracy and the rule of law'.

# Proposed Union with Greenside and St Andrew's & St George's West

Members of the Kirk Session met with representatives of the Presbytery's Deployment Group on 9 June as part of the Presbytery's consultation process relating to the proposed Presbytery Plan. For background, the congregation at Greenside has been without a minister for the past 12 months and during that time has been under the Guardianship of the Presbytery.

We shared Broughton St Mary's response to the proposals.

- Broughton St Mary's Kirk Session did not wish to be burdened with the maintenance of the Greenside building if a union was to take place.
- We learned that Greenside have plans to put ownership of the Greenside building into a trust but it has not been developed or approved.
- The minister shared the feedback from 4 congregational listening groups that our congregation held in May to discuss the proposed union. Listed were areas of positivity and concern.
- BSM is broadly in favour of moving towards union with Greenside and St Andrew's & St George's West.
- There was a consensus that members of Session and members of the congregations need to get to know one another prior to union and that holding joint social events is one way of achieving this.
- We suggested that a joint meeting of the 3 Kirk Sessions run by an independent facilitator to discern a mission plan for the joint parish would be beneficial.
- We were advised that Greenside's
  guardianship was due to finish at the end
  of June 2022 and that Greenside Kirk
  Session is not looking for a long extension.
  The Deployment Group wants to propose
  to Presbytery that the guardianship be
  extended to December and that Presbytery
  give a green light for Greenside, STAGWS
  and BSM to prepare for union in October,
  December at the latest.

At the Presbytery meeting on 21 June, Presbytery approved the continuation of the current basis of Guardianship for Greenside until 31 December 2022 and reported that recent discussions with Broughton St. Mary's and St. Andrew's and St. George's West have been encouraging, along with the local desire to move swiftly into the next chapter of the life of this congregation. It is hoped that discussions can move forward in order to allow Greenside to join with Broughton St Mary's and St. Andrew's and St. George's West.

## Sunday Worship
