

Musings from your minister

The other day, I was speaking with a colleague and we both marvelled how quickly the month has already flew by, wasn't it just Christmas and now we're making plans for our Lenten services with Ash Wednesday less than a month away. It does fly by these days. And as life is full of changes around the corner, personal challenges, and ongoing chaos, injustice and violence in our daily news, sometimes life feels like drinking from a fire hose.

In the confluence of these two dynamics, I often wonder how often the delight of God's creative spirit goes by unnoticed. It's so easy to do, to get caught up in the blur of life, that I, and I imagine some of you, tend to miss out on those brilliant flashes of awe. Those glimpses are what feed my soul, give me a sense of hope against the backdrop of the injustice in society, and are life-giving sources of inspiration.

Even though it is a scientific reality that time does speed up as we age, we do not have to automatically acquiese to this reality.

Psychologist, Dr. Steve Taylor, Leeds Beckett
University, suggests "a number of basic laws of
psychological time...One of these is that time seems
to speed up as we get older. Another is that time
seems to slow down when we're exposed to new
environments and experiences. "

These two laws are caused by the same underlying factor: the relationship between our experience of time and the amount of information (including perceptions, sensations and thoughts) our minds process. The more information our minds take in, the slower time seems to pass. As we get older, we have fewer new experiences and the world around us becomes more and more familiar. We become desensitised to our experience, which means that we process less information, and time seems to speed up." (Quoted from his article, "Time going too fast?" There are a number of academic papers which discuss this concept of time speeding up as we age. What I am learning from the research is that there are ways to shift the experience of time which can enhance our lives. By connecting with others, experiencing new adventures and developing our life long learning skills, we can re-energize our perspective on life. Sleep and a healthy diet also helps this process.

I was struck by a common comment I heard when collecting your stars during worship on the 22nd. I had invited you to write down what gift or attribute you brought to our community of faith. More than a few people said that they struggled to identify such a personal characteristic. I remarked that this is why the invitation. It is vital for all of us to affirm the gifts which God has blessed each one and everyone. For some, it will be a beginning point of discovery. For others, it will be a profound awareness and acceptance that indeed, you are created in the image of God, called by God to be your fabulous self and to empower to sharing those gifts with others.

This spiritual journey together is a part of a new adventure. Guided by God's spirit, we will be able to grow into the new reality that God is doing here at Broughton St. Mary's as we unite together with Greenside and St Andrew's & St George's West. It is an opportunity to develop a deeper sense of faith, have some fun, and perhaps most importantly, slow down time so that we can enjoy and delight in our incredible ministry together. The Edinburgh Gift Collection has been running for thirty-seven years. I cannot recall a time when your contribution to the gift collection was needed more than it was last year. The requests for gifts were the highest it has been for many years. It has been a difficult few years for all of us, due in part to the pandemic and the economy taking a turn for the worse. When I asked for your help for the thirty-seventh collection, I had no idea what your response would be. My friends, you never fail to step up to the mark. Your response for Christmas 2022 was to say the least amazing. I feel proud and privileged to be part of such a special group of people. I would like to thank you all personally for what you do.

This year, 259 children had presents to open. Over a thousand gifts were given out. The gifts were distributed through Christmas parties in the visits room organised through the visitors' centre and family contact officers. Gifts were also given out directly through the visitors' centre and delivered to those unable to collect the gifts. Thank you all once more for what you do in supporting the Edinburgh Prison Christmas Gift Collection.



A prayer for Ukraine on the one year anniversary of the war in Ukraine February 24


