

Musings from the Manse

The shift from our mild winter to somewhat hesistant spring has occurred in a mere blink of eye. In my six years of living in Scotland, I continue to be amazed just how quickly we move from the long dark afternoons and nights to bright, okay, relatively bright early mornings filled with bird song. I love the changing of the seasons and the surprising appearance of new critters in my backyard. Recently, I saw a grey squirrel, the first one since moving into the manse. For the past couple months, I have had a regular visitor from Corstorphine Hill, the badger to the right. Whereas the nightly visits from the foxes have become so routine that even the neighbourhood cats seem unfazed; in



contrast, the badger's presence is a bit of a concern for the cats. It does make it all quite interesting.

For the past several months, the ongoing conversations about the Presbytery Plan and our particular part of it have been taking place. The Plan has been approved by the powers that be and our Presbytery. Ian and I have been in talks with the ministers and clerks from Greenside and St. Andrew's and St George's West. Currently, the plan is that we will united with Greenside and then after a time period to be determined...a deferred union, the united Broughton St. Mary's / Greenside congregation will unite with STAGWS.

As the seasons change, so do plans. The proposed union with Greenside will now take place either in July or October 2023; we have been told, it would be most likely in October so we will see! Meanwhile, the basis of union is being worked out. The Greenside building is rated "B" which means it will most likely be sold. What we do know, for sure, is the Broughton St. Mary's will be the worship location of the united charge.

Meanwhile, as I mentioned in worship, we will continue to develop care circles within our parish and outreach to every member and adherent of BStM in our efforts to make sure we have a family and/or friend contact. Recently, as I underwent a medical procedure, I was ask for my next of kin or emergency contact. I realised that I do not have an official designated person. Also, when we found out through word of mouth that one of our members was in hospital, there was no way to contact her or her family member. We will be working on this project this summer. We want to make sure that no one falls between the cracks.

This summer, Sarah R, an ministry student from Austin Seminary in Texas will be with our congregation for eight weeks. She will be staying in the manse but will be available for a house sitting opportunity. I thought it might be good for her to experience Edinburgh city proper instead of simply being out in the suburbs of Blackhall. She will be spending two weeks up in Torphins, a wee village in Aberdeenshire.

Given that I am now waiting for a total knee replacement, and my mobility has dramatically decreased as a result, I was wondering if people would be interested in a weekly "Cuppa and a Blether" meet up at the church. My walking limitations are such that between the challenge of parking and distance from the church, home visits are quite difficult right now. My apologies but I am trying to figure out a workaround. Sincerest apologies for the delay of the Beacon as a result of pain management challenges. This is indeed an unexpected situation but through some creativity, I imagine we can find a good solution.

In the midst of the impending changes, we are invited to keep our focus on God and our faith in Christ, trusting that Jesus' call to love one another as ourselves will be transformative in both our personal and communal lives together. God's spirit is guiding us into a new reality, beyond our imagination or expectation. (Eph 3:20). It's all good.

Building Manager Job Description

Broughton St Mary's Parish Church is seeking a part-time Building Manager for their busy Community Hub. As well as church groups, the building is used by many different community organisations with on-going booking arrangements and a significant number of one-off events.

The Building Manager will work as part of the Admin team. The place of work is at the church 12 Bellevue Crescent EH3 6NE. Actual hours of attendance will vary depending on the bookings schedule, but will include evenings and weekends. A total of 15 hours per week is expected but is open to review in light of experience. Please see the job description for more details:

Duties and responsibilities:

- Prepare the sanctuary for worship, setting out seats and equipment for Sunday worship & set up Garden Room for teas and coffees
- Liaise regularly with Bookings Manager to confirm schedule of forth-coming building users
- Unlock building and welcome building users who require access mostly one-off bookings.
- Check building and lock it up when required.
- Enable access and oversee tradesmen and maintenance providers
- Set timers on boiler & entry system
- General light janitorial duties
- Be a welcoming and helpful representative of the church

The Building manager should have the following skills:

- Able to welcome people and help create a caring community
- Able to use own initiative and work with limited supervision
- Able to form good relationships and communicate effectively
- Flexibility to deal with issues as they arise
- Physically able to move tables and chairs
- Able to exercise discretion in dealing with confidential or sensitive matters
- Hold a PVG certificate (for working with vulnerable groups)

The Building Manager post is for 15 hours per week. Work is to be done on the church premises. The Salary is £11.50 per hour.
